

Outdoor Trip Leader

Department: University Recreation + Wellness (UREC), University of Arkansas - Fayetteville

Location: HPER Building, HPER 102 and Field Based Locations

Position Description:

The UREC Outdoors trip leader position is a field-based position that will be responsible for the planning, logistics, and execution of assigned UREC Outdoors (UO) adventure programs. UO adventure programs responsibilities include overnight or week-long multisport adventure trips that include but are not limited to canoe/kayak paddling, hiking, mountain biking, rock climbing, group meal planning and preparation, backcountry travel, backcountry cooking, group facilitation and teambuilding, and driving.

This position will develop UA Career-Ready skills such as Leadership, Professionalism, and Critical Thinking.

Duties & Responsibilities:

Operations and Logistics - 70%

- Assist in planning and preparing trips, including route planning, risk management, and emergency response procedures for day trips and clinics.
- Pack and organize group gear, food, and first aid supplies according to trip needs and UREC
 Outdoors guidelines
- Co-lead overnight or extended trips in a variety of environments (e.g., hiking, climbing, paddling, cycling)
- o Provide instruction in outdoor skills and promote Leave No Trace ethics throughout all activities
- Make field-based decisions in dynamic environments to ensure participant safety and manage group needs

Administration - 30%

- Model and uphold UREC Outdoors policies, acceptable field practices, and emergency protocols
- Respond appropriately to incidents, complete necessary documentation (SOAP notes, incident forms), and report to full-time staff
- Lead or assist with trip debriefs and post-trip equipment cleaning and storage
- o Provide and receive peer feedback to support program quality and staff development
- o Submit evaluations, trip logs, and other required documentation in a timely manner

Minimum Qualifications:

Current University of Arkansas student

- Must possess Wilderness First Aid or Wilderness First Responder Certification.
- Current Driver's License

Preferred Qualifications:

- Experience as a participant/shadow on multiple UREC Outdoors Programs
- Familiarity and experience with area hiking, paddling, cycling, and climbing destinations.
- Experience designing and leading outdoor recreation instructional programs, adventure-based programs, and events

Federal Work Study Requirement:

Federal Work Study award preferred but not required.

- Current Wilderness First Aid or Wilderness First Responder Certification
- Driver's License
- Required criminal background check.
- Required sex offender registry check.
- Motor vehicle record check

Physical Activities Associated with this Position:

The following physical activities are associated with the position and will be performed with or without accommodation. All individuals are encouraged to apply.

- Heavy Work | Exerting up to 100 lbs of force occasionally, and/or up to 50 lbs of force frequently, and/or up to 20 lbs of force constantly to move objects.
 - Hearing, reaching, standing, talking, walking- Constantly
 - Crouching, grasping, kneeling, lifting, manipulating items with fingers, pulling, pushing, repetitive motion, stooping- Frequently
 - Balancing, climbing, crawling, driving, handling of sharp tools, sitting- Occasionally
 - Lifting of heavy or awkward objects

Visual Acuity:

- Employee is required to have visual acuity to determine the accuracy, neatness, and thoroughness of the work assigned or to make general observations of facilities or structures
- Employee is required to have visual acuity to operate motor vehicles and/or heavy equipment.
- Employee is required to have close visual acuity to perform an activity such as preparing and analyzing data figures; transcribing; viewing a computer terminal; extensive reading; and/or visual inspection at distances close to the eyes.
